REGISTRATION AND CHECK-IN

OVERNIGHT ADVENTURE CHECK-IN

Gates will open and check-in will begin at 10am. Upon arrival in the parking lot, please bring your equipment to the camp office. Scouts and adults will need to check in at the Camp Office. All Campers who wish to swim or boat during the week, must be dressed in their swimsuits upon arrival. Bring any medical forms or prescription medications that need to be turned in to check-in. Once you have checked in with the health officer, you will be sent directly to swim tests. Staff members will deliver your equipment to your campsite while swim tests are being taken.

FORMS REQUIRED AT CHECK-IN

Each unit must submit a Unit Binder with completed Health Forms for each camper upon check-in. Adults attending Overnight Adventures must submit an Adult Information Form with their units camp registration form. Each Pack should submit the Extras Order Form for their group upon check-in.

LABEL YOUR GEAR!!!

WHAT NOT TO BRING

Alcohol, Tobacco, Fireworks, Firearms, Ammunition, Arrows, Chainsaws, Pets, Bicycles, Electronic Games, Expensive Items, and any other item that is dangerous or inappropriate. Failure to adhere to these policies will result in immediate intervention of the Camp Director or Program Director.

Animals: Pets are not allowed in camp. Please leave your pets at home.

Footwear: Open-toed shoes (except at the shower house) are not permitted in camp.

Pocket Knives: There is no need for any Scout to be carrying a pocketknife during his stay at camp. If a Scout is taking a specific activity badge or is taking part in the Cub Scout Whittling Chip Program, he is allowed, under adult supervision to have his pocketknife with him while taking the class. NO POCKET-KNIFE BLADES CAN BE LONGER THAN 3". SHEATH OR SURVIVAL KNIVES ARE NOT ALLOWED IN CAMP.

CAMP IDENTIFICATION

All Scouts and adults are asked to wear a wrist band while they are in camp. If you see an adult who does not have a wristband, please ask them to sign in. Scouts will be encouraged to wear camp activity t-shirts.

Some packs may choose to wear their own pack t-shirts on one of the days.

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BUDDY SYSTEM

Scouts should never be by themselves. Every camper will travel with a buddy. This will be covered with all campers during the camp orientation.

CAMP STAFF

Your camp staff is dedicated to making your experience fun, exciting, and unforgettable! Each staff member has been thoroughly trained and certified by the Boy Scouts of America's National Camp School. Our aquatics staff has been trained by the American Red Cross and our shooting sports instructors are BSA and NRA certified. In addition, each staff member has had a comprehensive criminal background check and been approved by the New York State Office of Child and Family Services.

SWIMMING TESTS

In accordance with B.S.A. policy, each Scout and adult must have a swim classification upon arrival at camp. The swim classification is conducted at camp as part of the check-in process. When the unit/camper arrives at summer camp, each individual will be issued a buddy tag. They will be color coded based on his or her classification. The tag may be used for the entire summer at Camp Kingsley.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS Overnight campers will sleep in lean-tos while at Camp Kingsley. Lean-tos sleep up to 6 campers or Adults. Guests may also choose to bring their own tents to sleep in. In some sites, 2 man wall tents are used for campers.

CAMP FOOD

Our kitchen staff is awesome. Forget about school lunches, we serve great camp food. Our summer resident camps offer three great meals a day including a salad bar and fresh fruit....and yes....peanut butter and jelly is available at every meal!

HEALTH & SAFETY

All participants must have a current Annual Health and Medical Record Form to participate. All camps that are more than 72 hours require Parts A, B and C. All medications must be kept in the health office. First Aid is available 24 hours a day in the camp Health Lodge. All of our staff is certified in CPR and First Aid.

PHOTO USE POLICY

Our staff and leaders often take pictures of our camp in action. These pictures may be included in our camp promotional materials. You will be required to fill out the Talent Release Agreement included in Part B of your Health Form. If you do not wish your child to be photographed, please inform your Cubmaster and the Camp Director in writing before camp begins.

FAMILY NIGHT

We will host a family BBQ and campfire on the last night of your session. Family members and friends are encouraged to come up for the evening. Tickets may be purchased at the pre-camp leader's meeting or at check-in. Cost for the barbecue is \$4 for those 10 and under and \$6 for those over 10. Children 3 and under are Free.

VISITING YOUR CAMPER

Parents may visit their Scouts at camp. All visitors must sign in at the Camp Office and wear a visitor wristband. Visitors are charged \$15 a day for meals. (\$4 Breakfast, \$5 Lunch and \$6 dinner) Visitors staying overnight must submit a physical form.

TRADING POST

Camp Kingsley operates a Trading Post located in the main office. Its hours of operation are posted outside the door.
