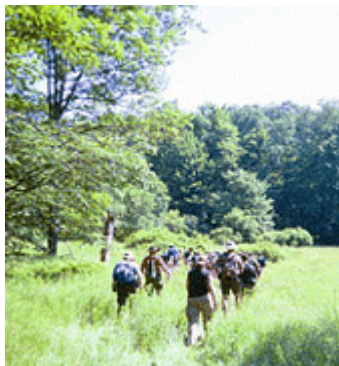




REGIONAL NAYLE COURSE

NAYLE will equip youth leaders to be better Unit Leaders, NYLT staff members and/or superior camp staff. It will help guide a Scouts' journey in leadership service to others, able to develop all members of whichever team they lead. It provides life skills for now and the future.

- Conservation

Participant Requirements

- Be 14 years of age by the first day of your course, but not yet 21 years old from Boy Scout, Varsity and Venturing units.
- Successful completion of National Youth Leader Training or The NYLT to NAYLE Bridge.
- Be in top physical condition; meet the part D requirements of the Annual Medical form.

Program Costs

The cost of the NAYLE program is \$355.00

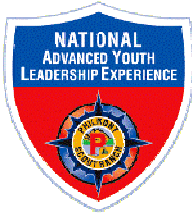

NAYLE and the NYLT Leadership Academy

After announcing that the Northeast Region will offer a NAYLE pilot course in August, 2011, one of the many questions that have arisen is: What is the difference between NAYLE and the NYLT Leadership Academy? We reply as follows:

The National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE) program was developed to be the third phase of the Scout Training Continuum after a Scout had taken Troop Leadership Training (TLT) and NYLT. NAYLE is intended for all youth who want an experiential program to practice NYLT methods. NAYLE provides Scouts with opportunities to use the leadership tools learned in TLT and NYLT through a series of learning modules that include situations where the individual Scout and the Patrol/Crew members can practice leadership. NAYLE emphasizes three (3) main areas: servant leadership, ethical decision making, and leaving a legacy. The focus is on the Scout's personal development to enable him/her to provide leadership in many circumstances at home, at school, in their Troop/Crew, in their religious institution, and in their community.

The NYLT Leadership Academy is designed to support local Councils by providing very high level youth staff development training, and it is offered to the youth who will serve as Council NYLT youth staff members. The NYLT Leadership Academy – formerly known as the Youth Staff Development Course (YSDC) - was developed six (6) years ago to replace the NJLIC program at Philmont, which was canceled after the 2005 season. The NYLT Leadership Academy has the primary focus of training Council's NYLT youth staff members to be more proficient and confident communicators, presenters and evaluators of the NYLT program in their own home Council courses. For information about the 2011 courses, go to the website www.NYLT-LeadershipAcademy.org Every Council in the NER has one fully paid scholarship available to promote excellence in their NYLT program. Note that, for the July, 2011 courses, the NYLT Leadership Academy has moved to Camp Snider outside Washington, D.C.

In view of the above information, all Scouts 14 years of age and older are encouraged to attend the NAYLE program provided that they have taken NYLT or participated in "The NYLT to NAYLE Bridge" orientation program. In addition, all Council NYLT youth staff members should attend the NYLT Leadership Academy.
